AT CHAMPION MINE

"The time of our lives!" exclaimed Dr. C. D. Donahue, who returned Tuesday from the winter outing at the Champion mine, in the Bohemia district. The snow-lovers are in a position really to indulge their passion for snow-in 15 to 20 feet!

The skiing is plus ultra, the mine buildings are snug and warm, the food good - what more could you ask. Giant icicles and snow drifts, long, steep hills, enchanting, "different" scenery and perfect isolation in the heart of these wild mountains makes the site ideal.

Bohemia Trip - By "Ace" Moore

A group of Obsidians, aided by four University students, made a special trip to the Bohemia country, scene of the winter outing, to transfer the food stored at the Noon Day mine to the Champion mine.

Saturday morning, Feb. 13th., the party consisting of G. Sims, B. McCracken leaders, R. Lemon, P. Lafferty, V. Hicks, M. Thompson, J. Hemmingway, E. Thurston, S. Mockford, W. Wood and A. Moore, left Eugene at 4 A.M. The party skied eight miles and reached the Champion mine at 2 P.M., where they rested briefly. Traveling as nearly straight up as possible for three miles and winding around and through the Champion saddle, thence over Grouse mountain, they reached their goal to find the original winter camp bunk house completely snowed in and presenting a hazardous task of entering the building because of broken rafters.

Packs filled, the return trip was anticipated but not welcomed. Skiing through thick timber and over a crusted snow, with heavy packs was more work than fun to the tired fellows. Continued on last page.

### INCORPORATION OF OBSIDIDIAN SKI CLUB

After conferring with attorneys, it was thought best to take this step in order to more clearly define the exact status of the club, make it a more permanent organization, and other advantages.

A committee is working with Jame K. King attorney, drafting the constitution and by-laws. Other ski clubs in the state have been contacted to get types of organization,

The Board of Obsidians, Inc. has agreed to grant the use of the name "Obsidian" to the Ski Club in their incorporated form when the constitution and by-laws are ready, maintaining substantially the same relationship between the clubs as exists at present.

This marks the culmination of growth in form of organization of the Ski Club from the ski committee of Obsidians, Inc. to a distinct entity with membership composed largely of Obsidians, but governed separately by members of the group.
