HAMLIN'S WILL ENTERTAIN FOR SPECIAL COUNCIL PICNIC

A COMBINED PICNIC AND SHORT BUSINESS MEETING WILL BE HELD FRI-DAY EVENING, JULY 30, AT THE HAMLIN FARM NORTH OF THE FERRY STREET BRIDGE. PETITIONS HAVE BEEN CIRCU-LATED AMONG CLUB MEMBERS, ADVOCAT-ING THE BUILDING OF A LODGE AT THE DEER BUTTE SITE, AND SUFFICIENT SIG-NATURES HAVE BEEN SECURED TO CON-VINCE A MAJORITY OF THE BOARD THAT THOSE OPPOSED TO THIS SITE ARE SMALL IN NUMBER, AND THAT A GREAT MANY
SLIEVE IN THE ORIGINAL RECOMMEN-

ATION OF THE BOARD TO BUILD HERE. THE MEETING IS CALLED TO SEE IF OP-INIONS HAVE CRYSTALIZED, AND IF SO, TO AUTHORIZE COMMENCEMENT OF WORK. WE WILL COUNCIL AROUND THE CAMP FIRE AFTER A POT-LUCK PICNIC LUNCH. OB-SIDIANS AND THEIR FRIENDS ARE INVIT-ED TO THE PICNIC, BUT ONLY PAID-UP MEMBERS MAY VOTE AT THE SHORT BUSIN-ESS SESSION. COMPLETE PLANS OF THE COMPLETE PLANS OF THE PROPOSED LODGE #144 BE SHOWN.

THE ANNUAL MT. WASHINGTON OB-SIDIAN CLIMB WAS MADE SUNDAY, JULY 11TH. THE MEMBERS OF THE PARTY DROVE INTO BIG LAKE SATURDAY AFTER-NOON AND EVENING VIA THE CLEAR LAKE ROAD, FISH LAKE ON TO THE NEW SANTIAM ROAD, THEN EAST TO THE OLD HOGG PASS ROAD WHICH JOINS THE OLD SANTIAM AT BIG LAKE.

THE PARTY "ROLLED-OUT" AROUND FOUR O'CLOCK AND RENEWED THE FIGHT WITH "SKEETERS" AS BIG AS DIRIGI-BLES. THE AQUATIC MINDED PAUL LAFFERTY AND MAXINE GLAD BRAVED THE WATERS OF THE LAKE AND VIGOROUSLY MAINTAINED THAT THEY ENJOYED THEIR EARLY MORNING DIP. EVERYONE WAS READY ABOUT FIVE O'CLOCK SO THE GROUP CLIMBED INTO THE CARS AND DROVE AROUND THE LAKE TO THE NORTHEAST SHORE AND LEFT THE CARS.

THE SKY-LINE TRAIL WAS FOLLOWED FOR ABOUT A MILE AND THEN THE LEAD-ER LEAD THE PARTY THROUGH THE TIMBER AND OLD BURNS TO THE NORTH RIDGE OF THE MOUNTAIN.

AMID TIME-OUTS FOR REST, PIC-TURE TAKING AND FOR VARIOUS MEM-BERS OF THE GROUP TO GET BACK ON THE TRAIL AFTER SLIDING DOWN THE SNOWY SLOPES, THE PARTY WORKED IT'S WAY UP THE LONG RIDGE AROUND THE WEST SIDE OF THE UPPER RIDGE PIN-NACLES. ABOUT ELEVEN O'CLOCK THE GROUP REACHED THE SADDLE AT THE BASE OF THE PINNACLE.

WHILE THE LEADER GILBERT SPRAGUE, PAUL LAFFERTY AND DOT DOTSON
TOOK THE ROPES UP THE EAST SIDE OF
THE OPEN PINNACLE, THE REST OF THE
PARTY RESTED. AS SOON AS THE ROPES
WERE MADE SECURE, EACH PERSON WAS
"DOUBLE-ROPED" PAST THE PREDARIOUS
PLACES. ALL ELEVEN OF THE PARTY
REACHED THE TOP AT 12:30, SIGNED
THE BOOK AND AFTER A FEW MINUTES
REST BEGAN THE SLOW DESCENT.

IN RETURNING TO THE CARS THE PARTY WENT DOWN THE WEST SLOPE OVER THE MEADOW BELOW, THEN THROUGH THE OLD BURNS AND THICKETS TO THE SKYLINE TRAIL A LITTLE ABOVE WHERE THE GROUP HAD LEFT SAID TRAIL DURING THE MORNING.

HOLIDAY CROWD ENJOYS NEWBERRY CRATER TRIP

THE 4TH OF JULY HOLIDAY AFFORDED THE OBSIDIANS AN OPPORTUNITY TO MAKE A VISIT TO NEWBERRY CRATER ABOUT 45 MILES EAST OF BEND.

TWO CAR LOADS LEFT SATURDAY AF-TERNOON AND WERE JOINED BY THREE OTHERS ON SUNDAY MORNING AT PAULINA LAKE. FROM THERE THEY DROVE TO EAST LAKE WHERE CAMP WAS MADE AND LUNCH EATEN. THEY THEN CLIMBER THE RIM LED BY MB. H. H. HULQUIT PRESIDENT OF THE BEND GEOLOGY FROM THE TOP COULD BE SEEN A BEAUTUL VIEW OF EAST LAKE. LAVA FOR AND MANY BEAUTIFUL PIECES OF OBSID-IAN ROCK WERE FOUND AND MYRTLE AND MANY OTHERS WENT BACK TO THE CARS WITH THEIR PACK SACKS FULL. A SWIM IN THE LAKE, A SEARCH FOR ARROW
HEADS AND A POT LUCK PICNIC SUPPER
FOLLOWED WITH A BIG BONFIRE WITH
LOUIE AS MASTER OF CEREMONIES. MONDAY MORNING THEY DROVE TO LAVA CAST FOREST WHERE MR. HIIGHITT EX-PLAINED ABOUT THE FLOW OF LAVA WHICH RESULTED IN THE CAST FOREST. TURES WERE TAKEN OF THE SNAKE TREE AND A TREE 300 YEARS OLD AND FIVE AND ONE-HALF FEET HIGH. MANY PE-CULIAR SHAPED PIECES OF LAVA WERE SEEN. ABOUT THREE HOURS WERE SPENT IN THIS AREA WHICH COVERS AN AREA OF THIRTY SIX MILES AND INCLUDES HUNDREDS OF LAVA CASTS. LAVA RIVER AND LAVA BUTTE WERE ALSO VISITED.
