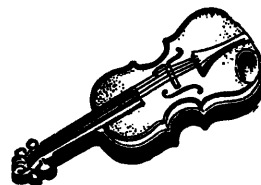
Local Walks Schedule

Ada, Roy and Helen Smith had the traditional dinner and enjoyed a show afterwards.

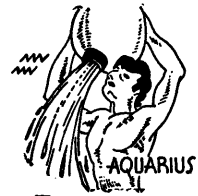
Nellie Moore had Thanksgiving with relatives in Corvallis. She accompanied her brother and sister-in-law to Portland where she visited until Sunday.

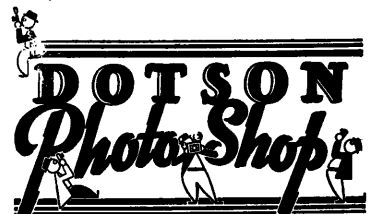
