- MAR.20 Sun.-Eugene to Payette, Idaho. 413 Miles. Overnite at Payette.
MAR.21 Mon.-Payette to Payette Lakes (7 to 10 AM). At Payette Lakes 10 AM to 4 PM. Payette to Boise. Overnite at Boise.
MAR.22 Tues.-Boise to Sun Valley (7 to 10 AM). Ski at Sun Valley. Overnite at Sun Valley, with ice skating, dancing, or theatre available.
MAR.23 Wed.-At Sun Valley all day. Stay at Sun Valley overnite.
MAR.24 Thur.-Sun Valley to Bogus Basin (7 AM to 12 NOON). Ski at Bogus Basin in PM, then on to Ontario, Ore. Overnite at Ontario.
MAR.25 Fri.-Ontario to Anthony Lakes--(7 AM to 10 AM). Ski at Anthony Lakes rest of day. Overnite at Anthony Lakes.
MAR.26 Sat.-Ski at Anthony Lakes until 4 PM, then on to Ontario. Overnite at Ontario.
MAR.27 Sun.-Ontario back to Eugene.
